ENVIROMISSION SOLAR TOWER JOINS SCPPA UTILITY PROJECT LIST

EnviroMission Limited (ASX: EVM) (OTCQX: EVOMY) is pleased to announce its Arizona Solar Tower project has been added to the [Southern California Public Power Authority](http://www.scppa.org/pages/projects/lapaz_solartower.html) ("SCPPA") *renewable energy projects* list on the utility's public website, http://www.scppa.org/pages/projects/lapaz_solartower.html

The board of the Southern California Public Power Authority approved a landmark Power Purchase Agreement on 21 October, 2010, to purchase power from the first of EnviroMission's 200MW Solar Tower developments in La Paz, Arizona.

The Southern California Public Power Authority is a joint powers authority consisting of 10 municipal utilities and one irrigation district. SCPPA members deliver electricity to approximately 2 million customers over an area of 7,000 square miles, with a total population of 4.8 million.

SCPPA members include the municipal utilities of the cities of Anaheim, Azusa, Banning, Burbank, Cerritos, Colton, Glendale, Los Angeles, Pasadena, Riverside, Vernon, and the Imperial Irrigation District.

SCPPA large-scale generation projects include hydro (Hoover Dam), Gas, Coal and Nuclear (Palo Verde) and three transmission projects, bringing power from Arizona, New Mexico, Utah, and Nevada.

SCPPA has a renewable energy portfolio standard aimed at generating 20% of all electricity from renewable resources by 2010 and EnviroMission's Solar Tower is the first large-scale solar technology commitment to be made by SCPPA to meet its renewable energy portfolio standard.

SCPPA board approval required member utilities identified as 'Project Participants' (end user utilities), to seek approval from their respective governing bodies to purchase agreed amounts of Solar Tower power from SCPPA via individual Power Sales Agreements. Power Sales Agreements have now been ratified by the boards of the participant municipal utilities of the cities of Anaheim, Azusa, Banning, Burbank, Glendale, Pasadena, and Riverside.

"The commercial in confidence nature of the Power Sales Agreement process bound EnviroMission to a non-disclosure agreement that prevented disclosure of specific details of the Power Purchase Agreement.

"This condition precedent was recently satisfied with the completion of the Power Sales Agreement process and SCPPA has advised EnviroMission it has published the addition of EnviroMission's La Paz Solar Tower project to its renewable energy projects list.

"EnviroMission is one of only a handful of solar energy developers to have a confirmed Power Purchase Agreement in place in the United States," EnviroMission Chief Executive, Roger Davey said pointing to the commercial significance of this milestone.
